


Gifford Youth Achievement Center

Dress Code Reminder

55* or cooler, students may wear jeans. Otherwise, students may only wear jeans on Fridays. If leggings are worn, they must be solid in color and under uniform shorts, dresses, skorts, or skirts (no designs, sparkles, or images on the leggings are allowed). Students must wear athletic footwear (sneakers) to school. Boots, heels, flip flops, slippers, crocs, and other types of open-toe/open-back shoes are not allowed. This is for your child's safety walking around campus, playing on the playground, and participating in cultural arts.
