This month's Casual for a Cause will benefit the American Heart Association. Students can dress in red for a suggested donation of \$1 on Monday, February 7th.

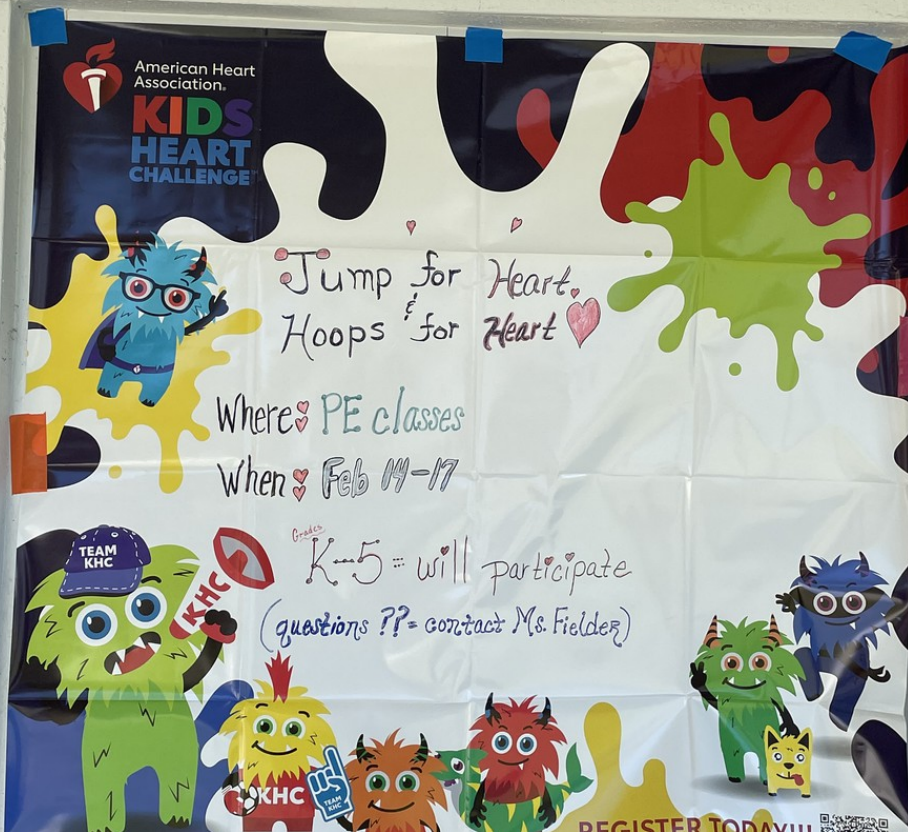

A huge thank you to everyone who supported Gifford Youth Achievement Center last month. Our school raised \$140!

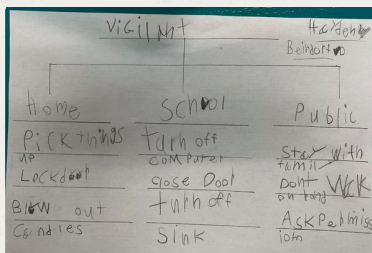
Jump for Heart & Hoops for Heart

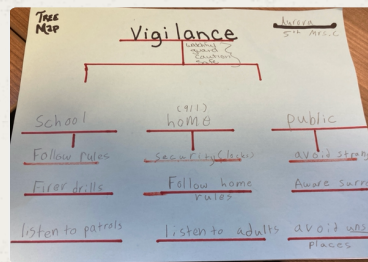


Vigilant Thinking Maps

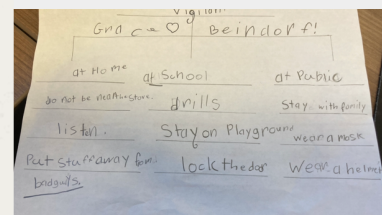
Last month students created vigilant tree maps about how they are safe at home, at school, and in public. Fins up to the following sharks and their hard work!



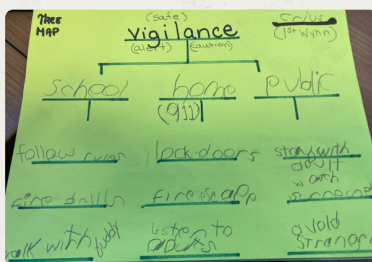
Hayden, Kindergarten



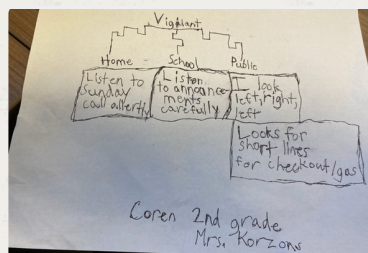
Aurora, Grade 5

Dress Code Reminder

55* or cooler, students may wear jeans. Otherwise, students may only wear jeans on

If leggings are worn, they must be solid in color and under uniform shorts, dresses, skirts, or skirts (no designs, sparkles, or images on the leggings are allowed). Students must wear athletic footwear (sneakers) to school. Boots, heels, flip flops, slippers, crocs, and other types of open-toe/open-back shoes are not allowed. This is for your child's safety walking around campus, playing on the playground, and participating in cultural arts.



LEGGINGS

Leggings must be solid in color and worn with uniform skirt, dress, skirt, or shorts



TEMPERATURE

Jeans are allowed on Friday OR when the temperature in the morning is 55*Fahrenheit or below



FOOTWEAR

Athletic footwear (sneakers) must be worn at all times to keep your children safe
