


# March 1, 2022


We are proud to serve more than 1,200 children each year through our after-school and summer programming. We have three clubhouses, one each in Vero Beach, Sebastian

A huge thank you to everyone who supported the American Heart Association (AHA) last month. Our school raised \$115!


#### **Digital Literacy in the Media Center**

Last month students created cause and effect thinking maps about what happens when they are ENTHUSIASTIC for learning. Fins up to the following sharks and their hard work!










Aurora, Grade 5



# **Thinking Maps**

## **Dress Code Reminder**

55\* or cooler, students may wear jeans. Otherwise, students may only wear jeans on Fridays.

If leggings are worn, they must be solid in color and under uniform shorts, dresses, skorts, or skirts (no designs, sparkles, or images on the leggings are allowed). Students must wear athletic footwear (sneakers) to school. Boots, heels, flip flops, slippers, crocs, and other types of open-toe/open-back shoes are not allowed. This is for your child's safety walking around campus, playing on the playground, and participating in cultural arts.



**LEGGINGS** Leggings must be solid in color and worn with uniform skirt, dress, skort, or shorts



### TEMPERATURE

Jeans are allowed on Friday OR when the temperature in the morning is 55\*Fahrenheit or below



FOOTWEAR Athletic footwear (sneakers) must be worn at all times to keep your children safe
