Air Potato Vine Lessons

Over the summer, the School District of Indian River County's Physical Plant worked with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to make efforts to control this **noxious** weed, the air potato vine. In an attempt to control the vine, air potato beetles were released as an alternative solution, than complete **eradication**. We are fortunate



to work with the FDACS and their beetle program. Students will be learning about <u>invasive</u> species during science connected to grade level standards and learn to apply vocabulary words like invasive, eradicate, and noxious.

Chromebooks for 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th Graders!

Please see the letter below or the hard copy sent home with all second, third, fourth, and fifth graders!

Dear Parent/Guardian:

This school year, the district participated in the FCC's Emergency Connectivity Fund (ECF) program that helps schools to provide the tools and services their communities need to help close the Homework Gap for students who currently lack necessary Internet access or the devices they need to connect to classrooms. Congress authorized the Emergency Connectivity Fund as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.



All students in grades 2nd-4th will be issued a Dell Chromebook. This device is issued solely for educational use. Any use deemed inconsistent with the purpose as determined by school administrators or by The School District of Indian River County personnel will be considered a violation of the Student Code of Conduct.

Expectations: If taken home, your student must bring a fully charged Chromebook to school each day. Students will be unable to complete classwork if they do not bring the charged device to school.



User Responsibilities: The student is responsible for ensuring the Chromebook and charger are not damaged, lost, or stolen while it is loaned out to him/her. Do not leave the Chromebook unattended at any time. Do not deface, write on, or put stickers of any type on the Chromebook. Your student will receive a case that snaps onto the Chromebook. They may decorate and personalize the case, but not the device. Keep food and drinks away from the device. Do not tamper with the device's hardware or existing software. The Chromebooks are filtered and monitored at home and at school. The district does not permit unethical use of the Internet, email, or any other media. Violation of this policy may result in the loss of device loan privileges and disciplinary action by the school.

Financial Responsibility: Student (parent/guardian) is financially responsible for the costs associated with replacement of the loaner equipment if it is severely damage, lost, or stolen. If the Chromebook is damaged, lost, or stolen, the student must notify the school's Administrator immediately. If stolen, student must file a police report and notify the School Resource Deputy.

<u>Fees</u>: The replacement fee for the Chromebook is \$400 and \$33 for the charger. The parent/guardian will be charged for damaged or missing parts. If fee is not received within a reasonable time, student will be placed on the school's obligation list. These fees are intended to promote good habits and responsible use of the district-issued device.

<u>Duration</u>; All Chromebooks are for the 2022-2023 school year and must be returned in good condition when devices are collected school-wide in May 2023.

Exiting the District: If the student is leaving the school district, the Chromebook must be returned to withdraw from school

In August, students were able to free dress on Monday, August 29th for the ELC and raised over \$150.







Riding the WAVE of Success






Create a Thinking Map for September

- 3. Tree Map Classify different places and ways to be warm-hearted


