Over the summer, the School District of Indian River County's Physical Plant worked with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to make efforts to control this noxious weed, the air potato vine. In an attempt to control the vine, air




potato beetles were released as an alternative solution, than complete **eradication**. We are fortunate to work with the FDACS and their beetle program. Students will be learning about **invasive** species during science connected to grade level standards and learn to apply vocabulary words like invasive, eradicate, and noxious.


